
Hungry Chimp

Little Chimp and Big Brother played in the grass. Mama said, "You two quit fighting right now!"




Mama shouted, "It's time for dinner! Come on in little chimps!"

Little Chimp said, "Here is something to eat."


"Yuck!" said Little Chimp. "This is no good."

Our aim with this series of books is to weave together two significant goals in the design of early reading materials—that the books are both instructional and engaging. Books designed to develop reading skills often end up feeling like work to read, while books designed to be interesting are often too difficult for beginning readers.

However, the books are written using pictures and stories that make sense and promote both language and conceptual development. The books encourage questions, conversations and thoughtful engagement, aiming towards the new common core standards.
